1. Bike share, e-bike legislation, and shared/micromobility devices

Following expiration of last summer's bike share pilot program, City staff has started planning for the release of a request for proposals to continue the service. Proposals are likely to include other devices beyond bicycles, including e-scooters and e-bikes. At the same time, the state legislature has recently passed legislation regarding several electric mobility devices, but did not address e-scooters and left room for local authorities to adopt further restriction on e-bikes. Information and discussion at this meeting will include:
