



Pipeline West Flood Area

BACKGROUND

The Pipeline Fire was reported on June 12, 2022, approximately 6 miles north of Flagstaff within the Coconino National Forest. The fire burned 26,532 acres, including portions of the Schultz Creek and Chimney watersheds. A burn scar assessment and flood modeling subsequently showed potential post-wildfire flood risk to neighborhoods on the west side of Flagstaff. Both the City of Flagstaff and the Coconino County Flood Control District are collaborating with public and private partners and taking extensive measures and precautions to mitigate damage from future potential flood events.

LOANS AVAILABLE FOR HOMEOWNERS, RENTERS AND BUSINESS OWNERS

Federal disaster loans are available to homeowners, renters and business owners affected by the severe storms, flooding, mudslides and debris flows that occurred 7/23 - 8/28/22. US Small Business Administration (SBA) representatives are now in Flagstaff through October 6 to meet with each disaster survivor and answer specific questions about how a disaster loan may help residents recover from the disaster. The representatives will also provide one-on-one assistance in completing applications for these loans. **The deadline to apply is November 18, 2022**

SCHULTZ CREEK DETENTION BASINS UPDATE

Construction work is ongoing and remains on schedule for the Schultz Creek Sediment and Flood Mitigation Detention Basins. Installation of concrete headwalls and overflow structures has begun and will continue throughout next week, with the entire project on track for completion by the fall of 2022. The project is located on the 20-acre parcel of City-owned land at the northeast corner of the intersection of E. Mt Elden Lookout Rd and Schultz Pass Rd. Please avoid the area if possible due to the construction activity. Once completed, the project will detain over 40 acre-feet of water and sediment, improving the downstream debris impacts thereby reducing life and safety threats as well.
